 2nd **Treasure** is a \$40 Cinemark Gift Card and a \$20 Nu Generations Bowling Gift Card

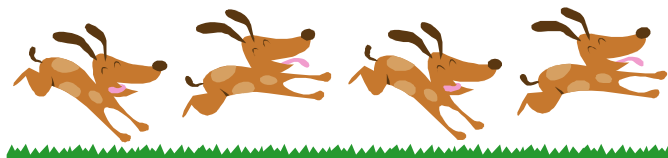
